Boyd tapped for district judgeship

Governor Frank Keating has named Blackwell City Attorney D.W. Boyd as the new district judge for the Eighth Judicial District.

He replaces Neal Beekman, who died last October.

Boyd, 45, is a partner in the Blackwell firm Boyd, Ihrig Associates and has been associated with the firm since 1982.

Prior to that, he was associated with the firm Rodgers, Rodgers & Boyd from 1975 until 1982.

Boyd was appointed as Blackwell's city attorney on Nov. 1, 1987. Prior to that, he served as the municipal judge from 1977-86.

Boyd is president-elect of the Kay County Bar Association.

He graduated from Oklahoma State University in 1972 with a bachelor's degree in Business Administration and earned his Juris Doctorate degree from Vanderbilt University in 1975.

He and his wife, Jackie, have two children, Bex, 16, and Blaine, 14.
